




New Officer Sworn In on Dec. 17th





2018 Property Crimes by Zone



- Property Crimes totals for 2018 were up from last year by 19%, however still lower than the total property crimes for 2016 by 6.5%.
- 84% of all vehicles burglarized were unlocked, and 51% of the homes burglarized were also not locked and/or windows left unsecured.
- In November, a campaign was started on Facebook called the #9PMRoutine. Each evening at 9:00 PM a Facebook message is posted to the Bartow Police Department FB page. The post reminds citizens to "LOCK-UP" before turning in for the evening. This includes all vehicles, and all doors and windows, and garage doors to make sure they are locked. The post also serves as a reminder to remove valuables, especially firearms from vehicles.
