♦ SCHAUFLER, Stacey "PERRY": Grand Theft, Tampering with Evidence, Using a Computer to Commit Fraud.

SYNOPSIS: In December, this BPD employee was terminated due to department policy violations. A subsequent inventory of the Evidence Room uncovered inconsistencies which led to a criminal investigation of Schaufler. This investigation revealed that Schaufler had been stealing currency from Evidence during her time of employment with the Bartow Police Department.

Detectives are currently working 151 Felony Investigations.

CRIME SCENE / PROPERTY & EVIDENCE


