Chief of Police Joe Hall Retired

On May 28, 2020 we said goodbye to Bartow Police Chief Joe Hall after 11 years of service to the City of Bartow. Deputy Chief Bryan Dorman presented Chief Hall with a gold chief's badge, a framed Bartow Police Patch, and an appreciation plaque for his years of service.

When Chief Hall came to Bartow in 2009, the first order of business he set for himself, was to have the Department accredited through the CFA. The goal has been challenging, however, in March 2020 the Mock Assessment was completed, and in August 2020 the final Assessment will take place.

Since 2009, Chief Hall has been the recipient of many honors, including: the Spirit Award in 2012, the Diversity Award in 2016, and he was Bartow's Relay for Life Chairman in 2012. He created the Citizens on Patrol Volunteer Program in 2011, the Community Services Team in 2012 and he brought back the Citizens Police Academy Program (2010-2018) with support and funding from American Legion Post 3.

In 2017 Chief Hall began monthly Chief Chats held at local restaurants, where citizens had the opportunity to speak about issues in an informal setting.

We appreciate his hard work and dedication to the city and the community, and for the accomplishments of the Bartow Police Department through his leadership.

Deputy Chief Bryan Dorman has been appointed Interim Chief of Police, and Sgt. Michelle Smith will be the Interim Patrol Commander.
