

On July 15, 2020, Officer Tim Daughtry and Officer Dallas Haynie were awarded the Commendation Ribbon by Interim Chief of Police Bryan Dorman. The officers received this recognition because of their compassionate effort and going over and beyond their duty to assist a disabled citizen.

Over the course of several weeks, Officer Haynie had befriended a disabled gentleman, frequently checking on him, and providing information on governmental and other social services to address his quality of life. During one such visit, Ofc. Haynie discovered that the gentleman did not have transportation to get him around town.



After discussing the predicament with his co-worker, Officer Daughtry, the officers devised a plan to get the man a bicycle. Ofc. Daughtry donated a bicycle and both officers presented it to him.

“These two Officers are true examples of the men and women that work at the Bartow Police Department and neither of them looked for recognition. I just had to recognize them for their kindness” said Interim Chief Dorman.

Although Covid-19 restrictions prevented a more intimate setting, the officers were presented with the ribbons during a small ceremony outside with their patrol squad (Alpha Squad).
