Michelle Smith Promoted to Captain, Becoming the Highest Ranking Female in the History of Bartow Police Deparatment

The Bartow Police Department held a small swearing-in ceremony on Monday, September 21, 2020. The event, held at City Hall was to swear-in new police officer Markanthony Fernandez. However, the ceremony also served to celebrate and introduce the newly selected Patrol Commander, Captain Michelle Smith. Captain Smith made history on this day, becoming the highest ranking female ever at Bartow Police Department.

Officer Fernandez was sworn-in first. His Father, a detention officer with the Maricopa Sheriff's Office in Arizona, had the honor of pinning his son's badge. Officer Fernandez's Mother and Step-Father were also in attendance. Officer Fernandez, who participated in the Bartow Police Explorer Program when he was a teenager, graduated from Bartow High School. He then moved to Arizona to live with his Father where he also worked at the Maricopa Sheriff's Office as



Captain Michelle Smith received the prestigious promotion and was also sworn-in as Captain. Smith, who in 2017 became Bartow Police Department's first ever female sergeant, has been performing the duties of Interim Patrol Commander since the retirement of Captain Hiram Saunders earlier this year. Captain Smith's family was there to enjoy the proud moment with her.

Captain Smith began her career at Bartow Police Department in 1999 as a Public Safety Aide while attending Polk State College. In 2001, Smith completed Police Standards and was sworn-in as a police officer, assigned

to the Patrol Section. Over the years Captain Smith has worked in many capacities including: Field Training Officer, Traffic Homicide Investigator, Honor Guard, Explorer Post Advisor and most notably, as a K-9 Handler and Trainer from 2004 to 2017 with her partners Vegas and then Hasj. Most recently, Smith has been assigned to the Detective Section as Sergeant, overseeing Criminal Investigations, Internal Affairs, Property and Evidence and the K-9 Units.


