Participating in the meeting were Interim Chief of Police Bryan Dorman, Captain Michelle Smith and Accreditation Manager, Kathryn Jones. The CFA award will remain in good standing for three years.



The Accreditation process, in which the agency is evaluated on compliance with prescribed standards

established by the CFA, has been a long one. In March of this year and then again in August, a team of assessors from CFA conducted thorough on-site assessments of the Bartow Police Department, examining all aspects of policies and procedures, management, operations, and support services. The CFA assessors found the agency in full compliance with over 200 standards.

The Bartow Police Department is committed to providing our community with professional and best practices through oversight of the accreditation process.
