The Citizens on Patrol (COP) Program, consists of a group of citizens, who regularly patrol the City of Bartow in pairs during daylight hours, in a Citizens on Patrol marked Unit.

COP Volunteers, after training, patrol the city, especially in residential neighborhoods and shopping centers a COP partner. The COP Unit provides the city with a more visible presence of law enforcement. The volunteers are trained to recognize and then report suspicious activity, and monitor the police radio and be alert should there be an emergency.

The COP volunteers routinely drive the COP vehicle and or the Police golf cart in parades, citywide events, and other activities.

Officer Agostino responded to a call for service reference a man unconscious lying in the front yard of a residence. Ofc. Agostino recognized that the man may have overdosed on narcotics and immediately used his agency issue Narcan to revive the man in order for EMS personnel to render medical aid. His quick actions helped the man regain consciousness and counteract the effects of the overdose. Great Job Officer Agostino!

Officer M. Fernandez responded to a residence where a subject was reported to be suicidal. Upon arrival to the residence, Officer M. Fernandez located the subject inside unconscious on the floor. It appeared to be an overdose of narcotics. Officer M. Fernandez did not hesitate to use his issued Narcan to quickly revive the subject, who was transported to the hospital for medical treatment. Great Job Officer M. Fernandez!

Both Officers' quick thinking and responses to the situations had positive impacts in the lives of two people in crisis. These are examples of police work at its finest.
