COP Volunteers, after training, patrol the city, especially in residential neighborhoods and shopping centers with a COP partner. The COP Unit provides the city with a more visible presence of law enforcement. The volunteers are trained to recognize and then report suspicious activity, and monitor the police radio and be alert should there be an emergency.

The COP volunteers routinely drive the COP vehicle and or the Police golf cart in parades, citywide events, and other activities.
