INTERIM CHIEF DORMAN PRESENTS LIFE SAVING AWARDS



On March 11th, Interim Chief Bryan Dorman presented two patrol officers with Lifesaving Awards. Officer Alexander Roque and Officer Jamie Sidler were honored for their quick actions, during an incident that occurred during an evening shift, earlier this year.

While patrolling on Jan. 26, 2021, at approximately 3:00 AM, Officer Sidler and Officer Roque were alerted by a citizen that a vehicle crash had just occurred in the area of Van Fleet Drive and Wilson Ave. Upon arrival, the officers observed one of the vehicles engulfed in flames. The flames were spreading from the engine area into the passenger compartment. The officers noticed the driver was unconscious behind the wheel of the car.



Without hesitation, the officers forced entry into the vehicle, and removed the driver, dragging him to safety. Almost immediately, the vehicle's passenger compartment was overtaken by flames. Without their quick actions, and putting themselves in harm's way, the driver may have perished in the fire.

The actions by these officers are the epitome of a true public safety professional, and we commend them on a job well done!
