Annual L.B. Brown Festival

On Saturday May 22, 2021, members of the Bartow Police Department participated in the Annual L.B. Brown Festival. The annual event, which is normally a 3-day festival held in February, was scaled-down to one day due to Covid concerns.

The L.B. Brown House was designed and constructed in 1892 by a self-taught master carpenter, Lawrence Bernard Brown. Mr. Brown, born into slavery in 1856, had limited formal education. Lawrence Brown overcame those debilitating circumstances and became one of Polk County's most successful businessmen and community leaders.

Brown was named "A Great Floridian" by the Florida Department of State. The house, listed on the National Register of Historic Places, may be the only one of its kind in Florida, still in existence, that was built and owned by a former slave.

The L.B. Brown House, located at 470 South L.B. Brown Ave, is also one of the exhibits in the Smithson-

ian National Museum of African American History and Culture in Washington, D.C.

Officer Haynie, a member of Alpha Squad, joined the Bartow Police Department in November 2019.




Two New Officers Sworn-In




