Captain Diaz will oversee several department sections including: Investigations, Records, Community Services, Training & Recruiting, and Facilities.

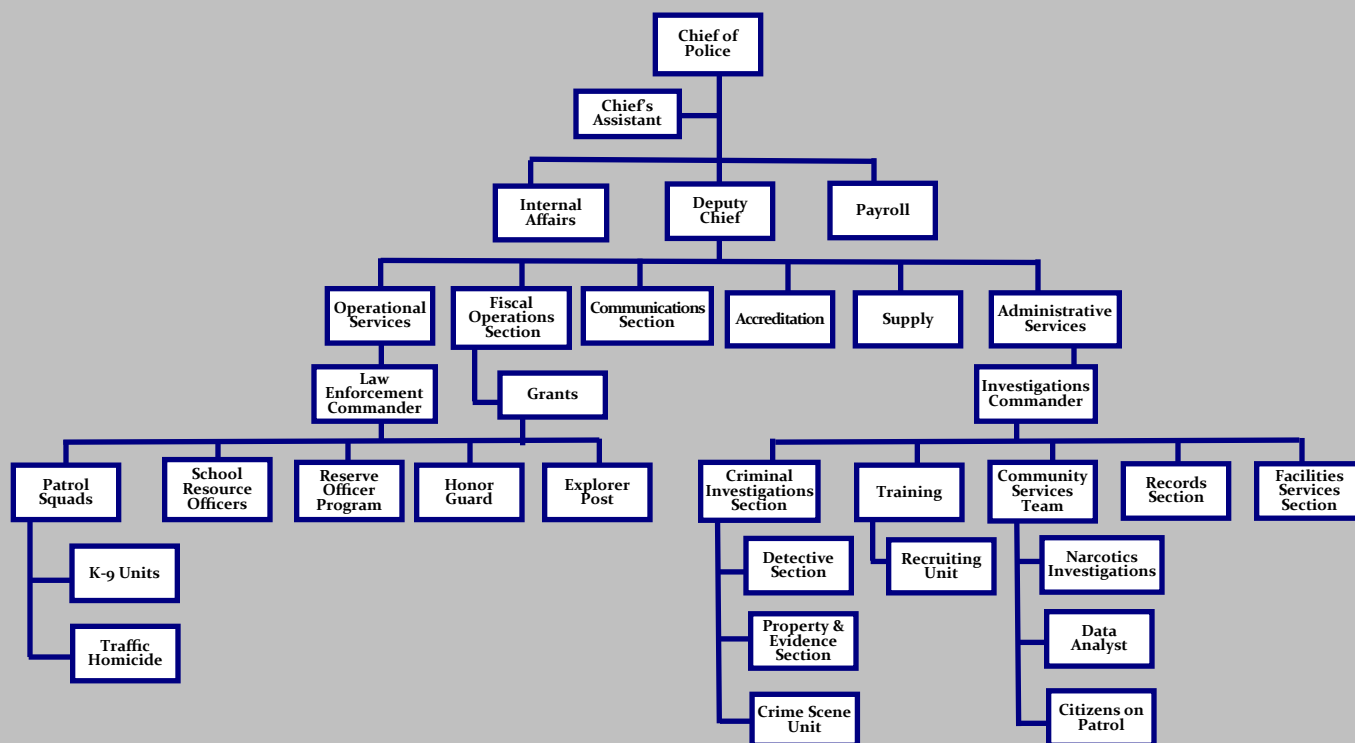

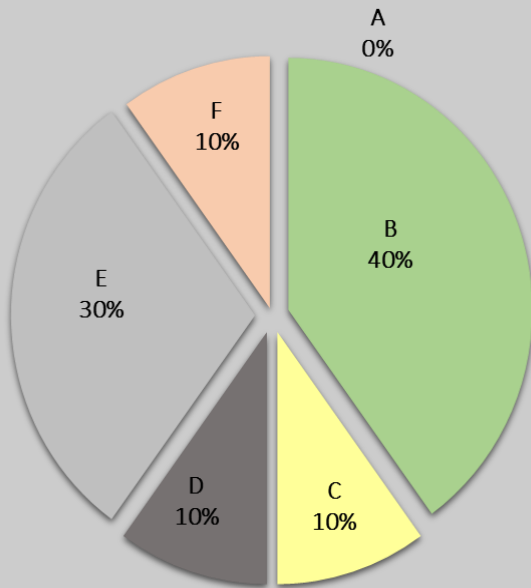
