# Patrol

### EDUCATION ACHIEVEMENTS:

Officers completed their monthly Police One and Police Law Training.

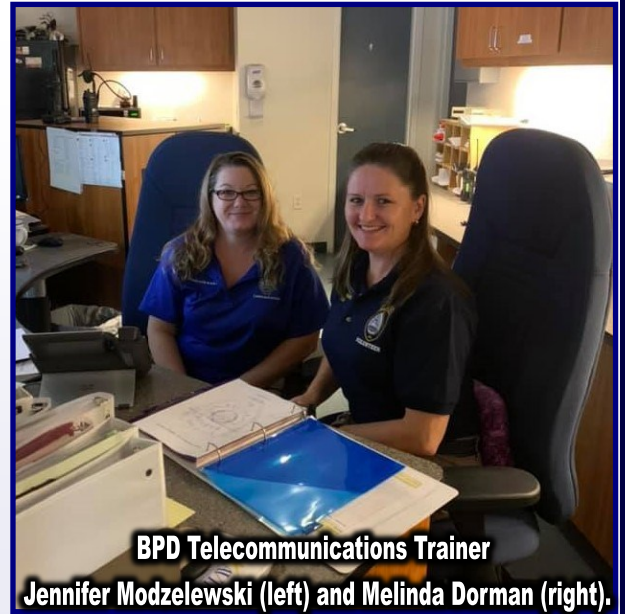
## BHS Criminal Justice Teacher Mrs. Melinda Dorman Training for Certification as 9-1-1 Telecommunicator

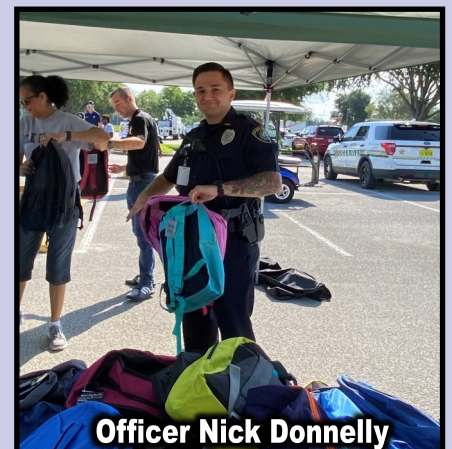

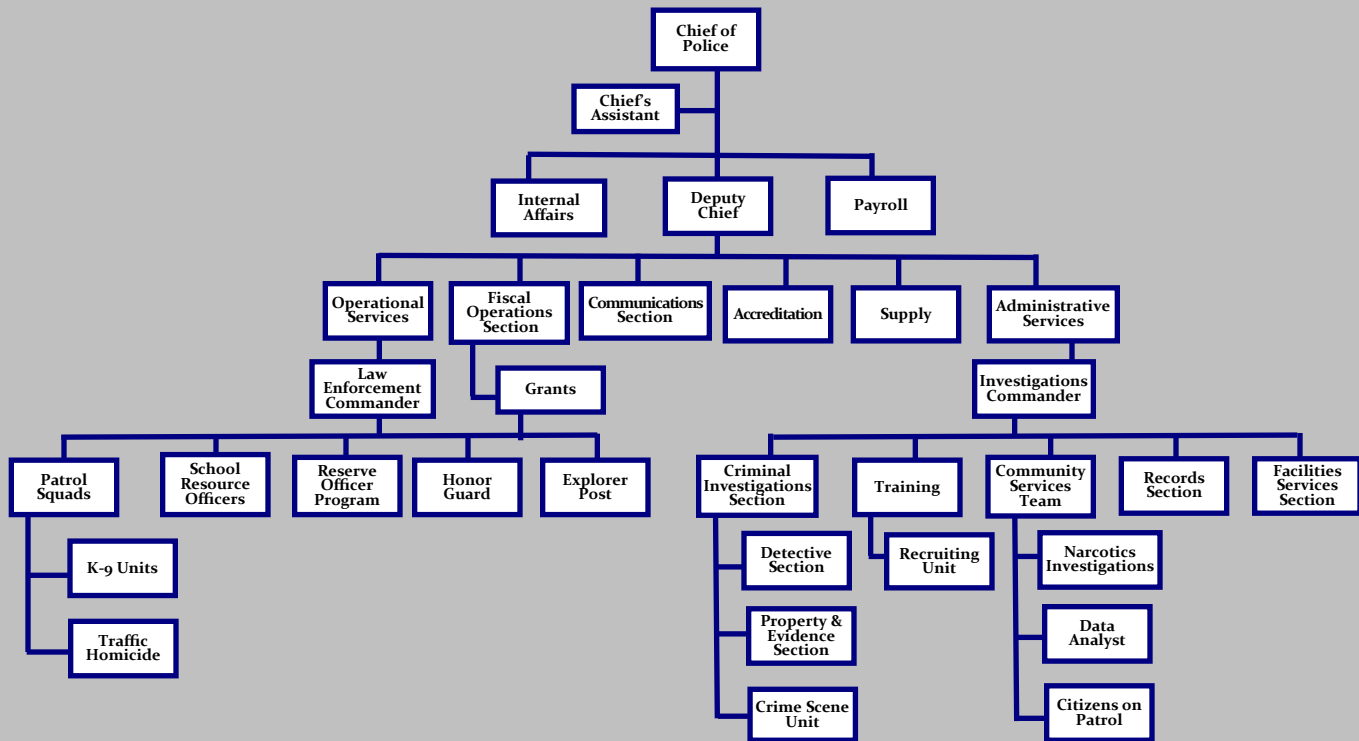

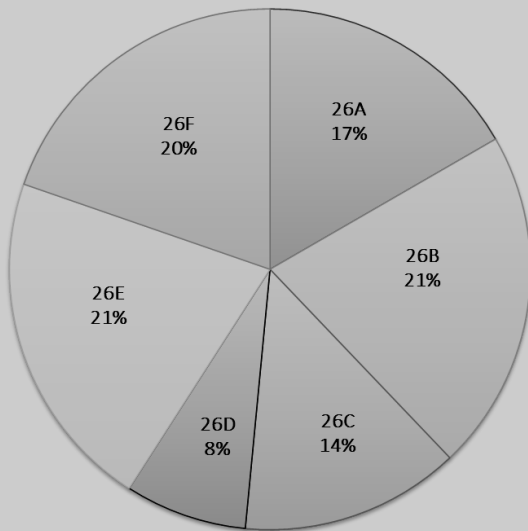
