In the Physical Agility portion, applicants were required to complete an obstacle course within a specific time frame. Bartow Firefighters were on standby for anyone requiring medical assistance.


In addition to the Physical Agility portion, the selection process also includes oral interviews, and those will take place in December.

On Friday Nov. 27, one day after a child with Autism was reported missing and endangered, a public request was made on social media outlets, seeking volunteers to help search for the missing child.


Several citizens, police volunteers, reserve officers answered the call to come out and help. Hundreds of followers on Facebook shared the post regarding the missing child.


