## Annual Law Enforcement Memorial Event

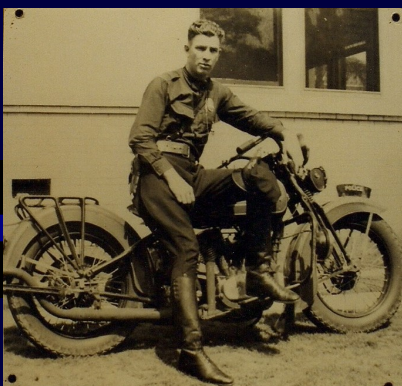
The Annual Law Enforcement Memorial Service was held in Lakeland on May 5, 2022.

Town Marshal Silas W. Campbell was killed by firearm on Saturday, May 15, 1886.

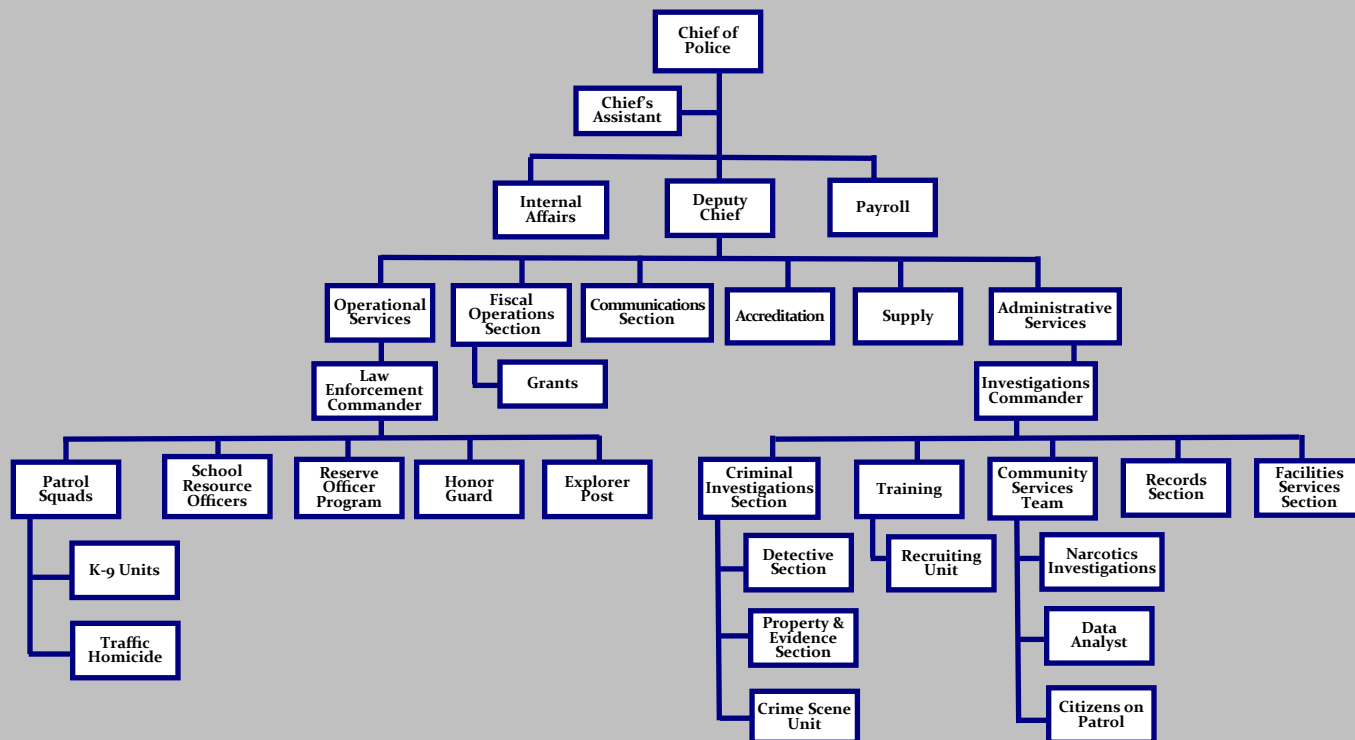
Officer Bush, a motorcycle patrolman, was hit and killed while on patrol on January 26, 1954

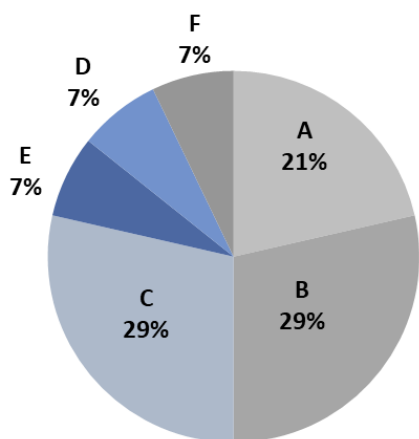
