Hurricane Ian

In mid September 2022, authorities began tracking a tropical storm, and in due time the storm became Hurricane Ian.

Emergency meetings and hurricane preparations commenced and eventually it became apparent the storm would have a large impact on the State of Florida, and Polk County.

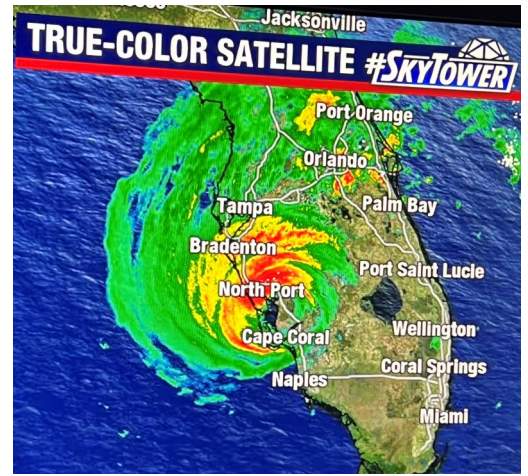
The Bartow Police Department implemented emergency orders which included members working 12-hr shifts, 6:30 AM -6:30 PM. With expected high winds and threat of flooding, many members were unable to drive home after their shift, and offices served as make-shift sleeping quarters.

Several meals were prepared by those assigned to KP, with not many leftovers. When the storm was directly over the city, and winds were very strong, patrol and emergency personnel were confined to the station for their safety.

Once the hurricane passed, the very difficult task of accessing damage, checking on citizens, clean-up, and restoring power and water began, and is still ongoing into October.

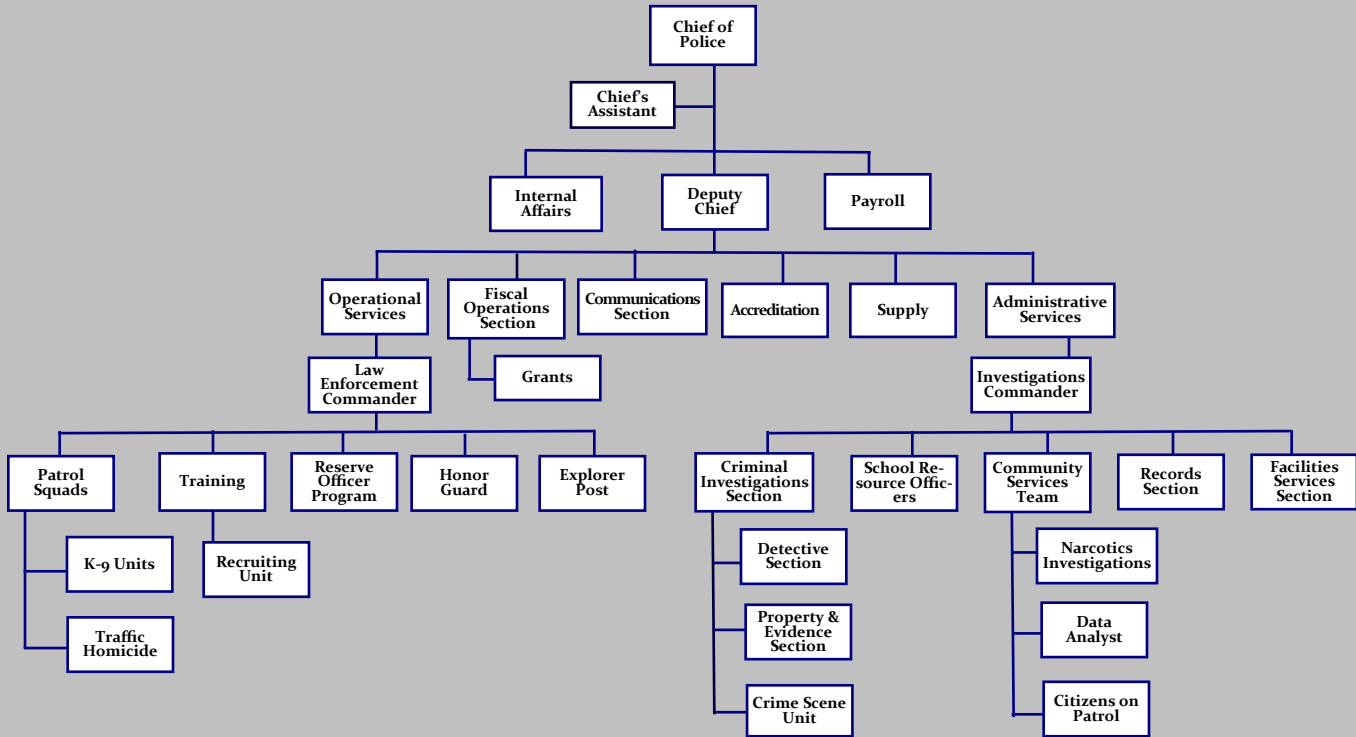
Terrie Lobb and Sweet Magnolias Café provided several

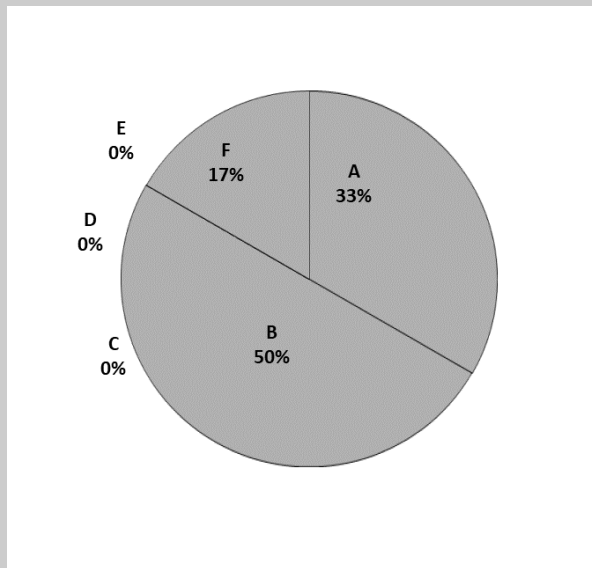
