Later in the day, everyone prepared for the Halloween Parade and the Halloween Carnival.

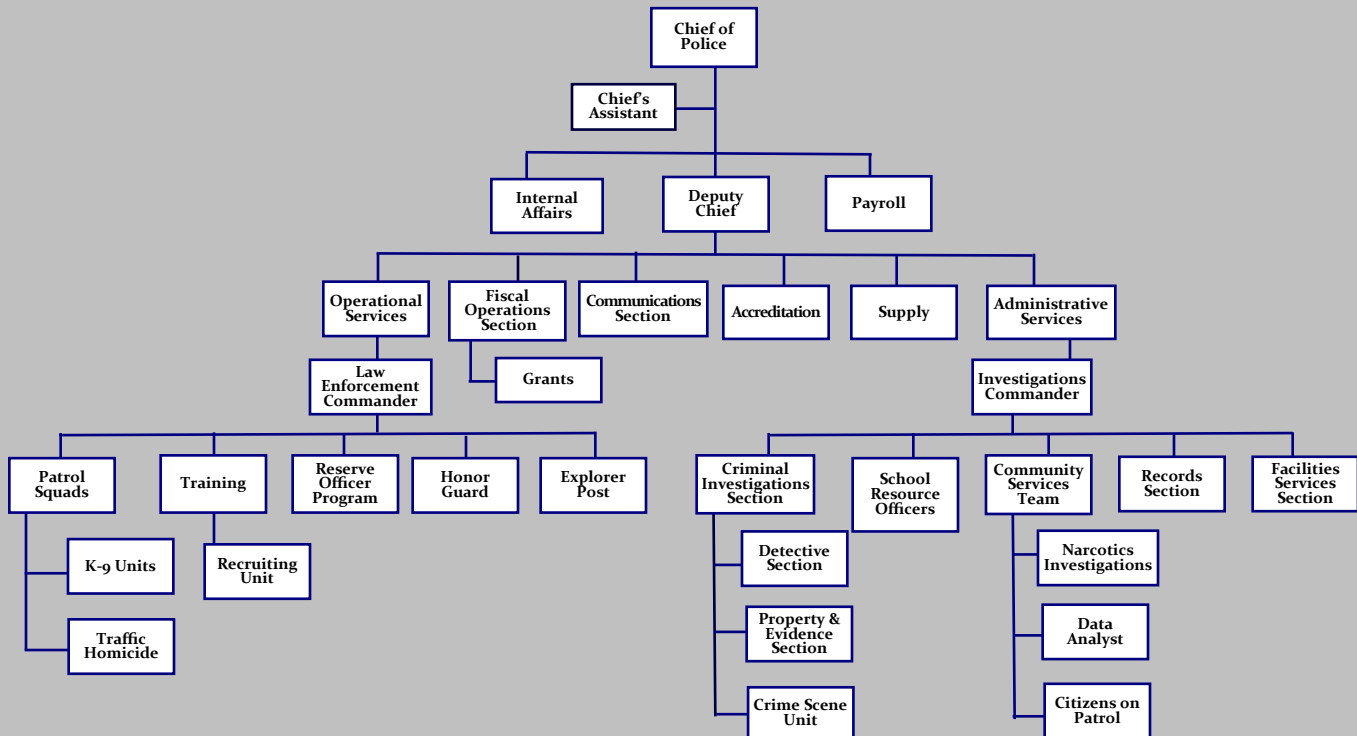


BHS Students from Forensics Class assisted the CSI Unit with Halloween preparations and walking in the parade.

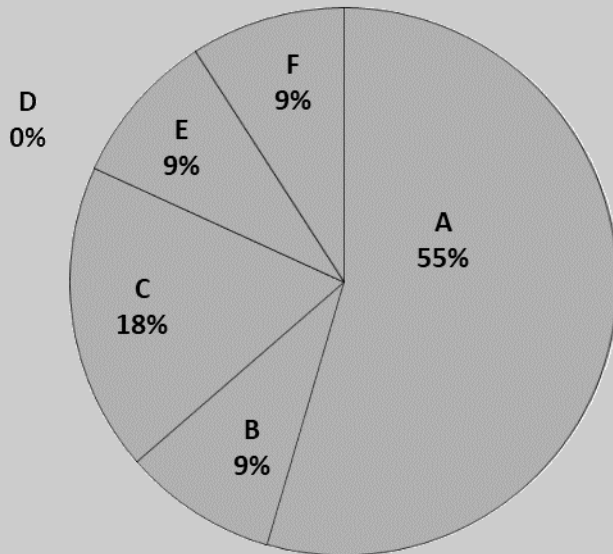
