A second Armed Robbery occurred in Azalea Gardens mere days after the previous robbery. Detectives Griffith and Vaughn traveled to Miami to interview VAUGHN. Based on the interview, VAUGHN was also charged in a shooting which occurred in July.




Does Neighborhood Watch Work?
