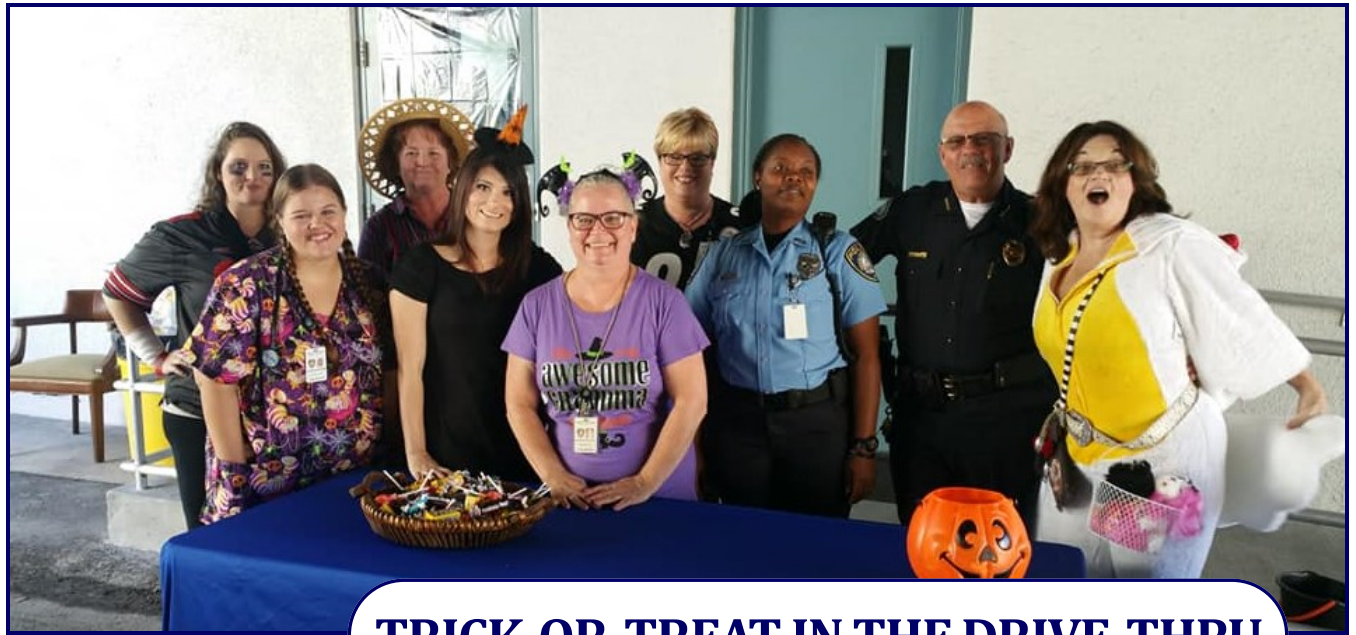

- ♦ KELLY, Joey, Jr: Robbery w/Weapon, and Aggravated Battery with a Deadly Weapon.
- ♦ PENDER, Audra (Mother of Victim) and CHRISTIAN, Matthew: Aggravated Manslaughter of a Child and Tampering with Physical Evidence. CHRISTIAN was also charged with Possession of Child Pornography and Disseminating Harmful Materials to a Child. These arrests are the result of an eight (8) month long investigation into the death of a child.
- ♦ TANKSON, James: Sexual Battery on a Child, Occupied Burglary and Battery.
- ♦ WHITE, Sherita: Aggravated Battery with a Deadly Weapon.
- ♦ MCDANIEL, Angela: Uttering a Forged Document.

The Detective Section's monthly clearance rate for October was 19%

Detectives are actively working 103 Felony Cases.

CRIME SCENE & PROPERTY EVIDENCE:

- 140 Items of evidence was received, catalogued, and filed.
- Photo Evidence was collected in 78 cases.
- 60 items of evidence was submitted to PCSO/FDLE for identification.
- Crime Scene Tech Lloyd and Perry completed 51 evidence requests from outside agencies (SAO/PDO etc.).
- CS Tech processed evidence relative to 14 cases, recovering 16 pieces of latent evidence which was submitted to PCSO for identification.
- A COSIS DNA match was obtained from evidence collected by CST Lloyd in reference to an unsolved burglary case. This investigation remains ongoing and now has a viable suspect due to CST Lloyd's diligence.

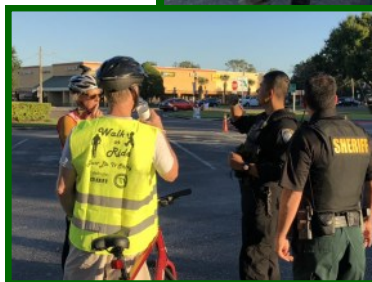
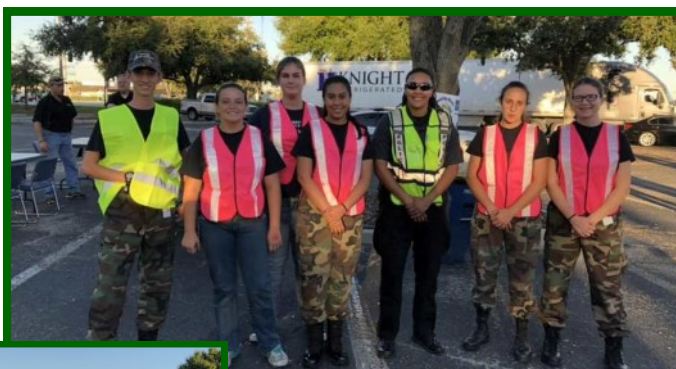

Does Neighborhood Watch Work?

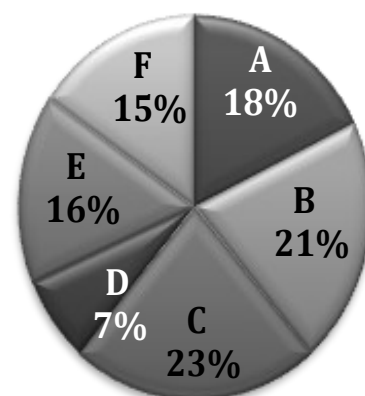
